Making Christmas Bright lives up to name

Port St. Lucie – More than 50 local businesses and community groups joined Devereux Community Based Care's Making Christmas Bright gift collection this month, bringing in more than 3,000 gifts for children in foster care and continuing an upward trend in giving that began last year.

Gifts have been on the uptick since Guardians for New Futures joined the Making Christmas Bright project last year to coordinate drives in Indian River, Martin and Okeechobee counties.

Minton Law PA, which fulfills the gift wishes of all teenagers in St. Lucie County - about 120 of them - also deserves credit for the increase.

"We have a few key sponsors who take on broad swaths of our population, and that has really made a difference," said Christina Kaiser, Devereux CBC Community Relations Director and Making Christmas Bright project coordinator.

Ms. Kaiser also credits the loyalty of long-time sponsors, like St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, which has participated in the project since its inception, and a constant stream of new partners drawn in by the media sponsorship of The Hometown News.

Donations also come in through holiday parties hosted for local foster families. For example, the Junior League of Indian River County has been sponsoring a Christmas party for local foster families since 2001. This year, the League got some help from the law first of Rossway, Swan, Tierney & Barry, which chooses an agency each year to assist with holiday gifts. Thanks to the partnership, all 43 children attending the December 13 party received several gifts from a visiting Santa.
